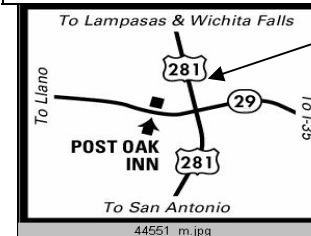

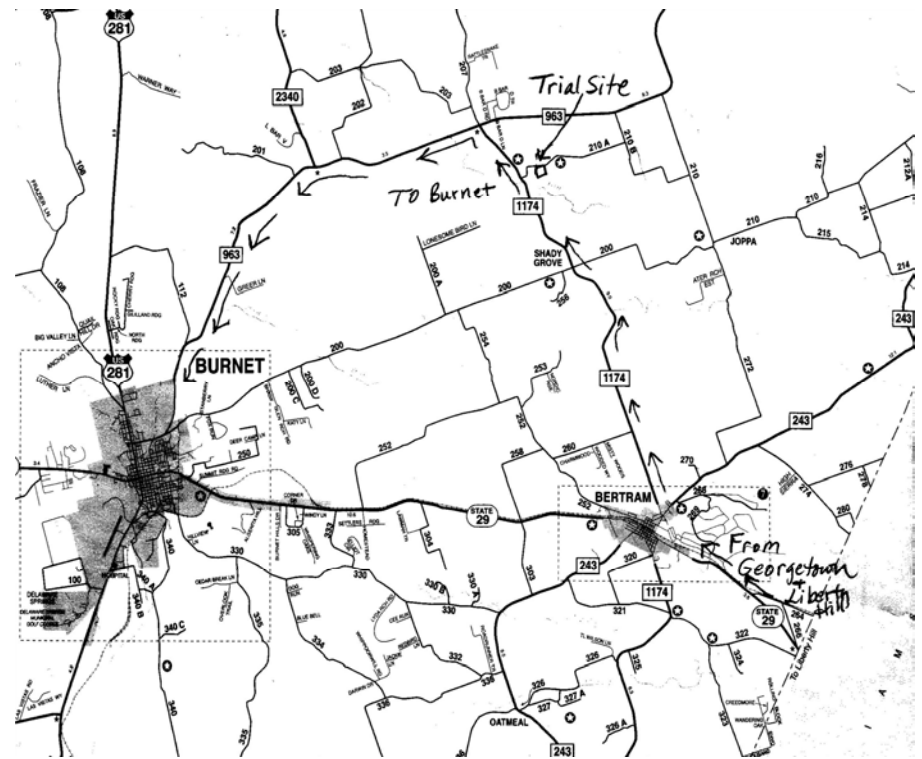

Go North on Hwy. 281 and turn east on RR 963/County Road 200. Then take RR 963 north for approximately 10.5 miles. Turn right or south onto RR 1174 and go just over 1 mile and turn left onto County Road 210A. We are the second property on the right at 601 on the gate.

Notice to Exhibitors

- I. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent (unless replaced by an Alternate), disqualified, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Test/Trial Committee.
- II. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- III. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the Club organizing committee.
- IV. No refunds for duplicate entries. However, care will be taken to find duplicates before processing. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors.
- V. Checks that have been returned due to insufficient funds do not constitute a valid entry and will have a \$25.00 service charge attached.
- VI. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

I further agree that I will hold the AHBA, its officers, directors, agents and members harmless and defend them from any and all liability for any injury, claim, damage or loss, of whatever kind or nature, whether to person or property, caused at or near this event, whether directly or indirectly, by me or any dog I have entered in or brought to this event. I agree to indemnify the AHBA, its officers, directors, agents and members for any loss, cost or expense including attorneys fees and costs, to which the AHBA, its officers, directors, agents or members might be subject as a result of any claim, suit, loss or damage caused in any way by any act or negligence on my part or on the part of any dog or dogs I have entered in or brought to this event. I acknowledge that while the AHBA may provide sanctioning for this event with regard to the issuing of titles, it does not have and does not exercise control over the conduct of the event or those present. HRD COURSE DESCRIPTION -- AHBA Ranch Dog Trial, Destiny Farm,

April 16, 2010

Throughout the course, the emphasis should be on smooth, calm, practical work. The sheep should move steadily and quietly, without rushing, lagging or weaving and the dog in contact with the stock. Except as otherwise specified on certain parts of the course, the dog and handler may take various positions, relative to the sheep throughout the course. The time limit for the course is 30 minutes. Ties within classes will be broken on: 1st, highest score on outrun, lift and fetch from Exercise 5; 2nd, highest score on Exercise 2 "Hold, Mark & Gate Sort"; 3rd, best time. Stock shall be held off gates to facilitate gate opening. All gates may be open/closed at the handler's discretion; however, time will not end until all gates have been restored to their original/starting position. Eight sheep will be used in each run.

1. START Pen Work –10 pts: Hold pens are 4' high and 8' X 8' metal panels.

Handler and dog will enter 10' Alley gate at the entrance to the barn. Close gate. Stock are taken from one of the 5 holding pens designated by the judge. Move the sheep to Pen A, 12' X 20', 4' high metal panels, through Gate 1. Close gate.

HRD I: Dog may be kept on leash until arriving at hold pen area. Handler may enter pen and assist dog.

HRD II: Dog must be taken off lead immediately inside Alley Gate. Handler may step inside hold pen gate, but may not further assist dog in gathering sheep.

HRD III: Dog must be taken off lead immediately inside Alley Gate. Handler is to remain outside of pen.

Alleyway is 10' wide. Exercise starts when hold pen gate is open and exercise ends when stock have been moved through Gate 1 into Pen A and Gate 1 is closed.

2. Hold & Mark (ribbon) and Gate Sort - 15 pts: Flag ribbon tape will be found in bucket near Gate 1. Attach ribbon(s) around sheep's neck(s). Gate sort 3 marked/unmarked head of stock out of Pen A through Gate 1 and into one of the empty Hold Pens and close gate. Move the remaining 5 head of sheep out of Pen A through Gate 1 to and through Gate 2 and into Pen B, 20' X 30', 5' cattle panels and field fencing. Get the three marked/unmarked sheep from the Hold Pen and move them to and through Gate 2 into Pen B rejoining the original 5 head of sheep. Move all 8 head of sheep through Gate #3 and close gate.

HRD I: Handler to attach a ribbon on one sheep while dog holds stock calmly. Gate sort any three sheep through Gate 1.

HRD II: Handler to attach ribbons on two sheep while dog holds stock calmly. Gate sort at least one marked sheep and any other two sheep through Gate 1.

HRDIII: Handler to attach ribbons on three sheep while dog holds stock calmly. Gate sort the three marked sheep only through Gate 1.

TIP: Pre-tie ribbon before placing on sheep. Exercise begins when Gate #1 is closed and ends when all stock, handler and dog exit Gate 3 and is closed.

3. Drive to Graze, Call-Off– 10 pts: B course arena is 300' X 600', field fencing. The graze zone is approximately 75' X 125' located on the west fence in the lower 1/3 of the field. Upon exiting Gate #3 into Course B arena, move stock into the graze zone. Call off dog. Dog and handler to move to the appropriate level handler's post/position.

HRDI: Dog fetch/wears or drives throughout. Handler calls off dog and meet at the HRDI post.

HRDII: Dog fetches/wears or drives up to HRDII handler's marker. Handler may not pass ahead of the marker. Dog drives the stock into the graze area, is called off and handler and dog move to HRDII handler's post.

HRDIII: Handler remains at Gate #3 while dog drives stock into graze area. Once stock have past the HRDII handler's marker, the handler may begin walking eastwards toward the handler's post while dog continues to drive stock into the graze. Once stock are in the graze, the dog is called off and dog and handler meet at the HRDIII handler's post. Exercise begins when Gate #3 is closed and ends when handler and dog have moved to handler's post.

HRDIII: Handler remains at Gate #3 while dog drives stock into graze area. Once stock have past the HRDII handler's marker, the handler may begin walking eastwards toward the handler's post while dog continues to drive stock into the graze. Once stock are in the graze, the dog is called off and dog and handler meet at the HRDIII handler's post. Exercise begins when Gate #3 is closed and ends when handler and dog have moved to handler's post.

4. Gather – 15 pts: From the handler's post, handler sends dog in either direction to gather stock. Sheep need to be in the graze zone. If they have drifted and the dog did not cause the drift, (points off), then dog can reset stock to center of graze zone. If no reset is desired, then the lift will be judged at the point of pickup by the dog regardless of whether the sheep have drifted. Stock will be fetched to handler and the stock will turn to the right of the HRDII/III cone to prepare for the Z chute obstacle.

HRDI: Dog is left at the HRD I post. Handler may go within 15 feet of the sheep before sending dog to gather stock. Dog may fetch/wear or drive to the HRDII/III handler's post and turn the stock counter clockwise around post. Gather is 100'.

HRDII: Dog is left at the HRD II/III post. Handler may go half the distance to the sheep before sending dog to gather stock. Dog may fetch/wear or drive to the HRDII/III post and turn stock counter clockwise around post. Gather is 200'.

HRDIII: Handler and dog must remain at the HRD II/III post. Handler will send dog from that cone. Once the dog has lifted the sheep from the graze zone, the dog must fetch/wear or drive the sheep to the Level II/III handler's cone and take the sheep counter clockwise around the cone. Gather is 200'. Exercise starts when dog is sent on the gather. Exercise ends when Handler, dog and stock go counter clockwise around HRD II/III post.

5. Z Chute & HRD III Hold – 10 pts: Move stock_ from the HRDII/III post to the Z Chute on the east fence.

HRDI: Handler may assume any position, dog can fetch/wear or drive. Handler may not enter obstacle.

HRDII: Handler may walk up to 10' in front of the entrance to the Z Chute with the stock but must remain at this point until stock are driven through the Z Chute. Once the last sheep exits the Z Chute, handler may assume any position and the dog may fetch/wear or drive. Handler may not enter obstacle.

HRDIII: Handler must remain at the HRDII/III post while the dog drives sheep to and through the Z Chute. Once the stock have exited the Z Chute, dog is to HOLD stock near the exit of the Z Chute while handler arrives to that point. Exercise starts after stock has gone counter clockwise around the HRDII/III post and ends when stock have exited the Z Chute and HRD III handler arrives back to dog and stock.

6. Panel Obstacle - 10 pts: Move stock from the exit area of the Z Chute to and through Drive Panels. Turn stock to the left around drive panels and head stock southward.

HRDI: Dog may fetch/wear or drive throughout exercise. Handler may not walk through the panels.

HRDII: Dog may fetch/wear or drive stock to about 25' in front of the drive panels where the handler must remain while dog drives the stock to and through the drive panels turning stock to the left and then southward.

HRDIII: Handler must remain at the exit area of the Z Chute while dog drives stock through the drive panels and turns stock left after stock passes through panels and then turns the stock southward. Handler may walk toward the Y Chute when stock are moving southward. The exercise begins when stock are moved from the exit area of the Z Chute. Exercise ends once the sheep have crossed the plane of the panels, turned left around panel, and sheep are turned southward.

7. Y Chute – 10 pts: Head the sheep south toward the Y Chute. Move stock to and through the Y Chute continuing southward toward the barn. Move stock through Gate #4 and close gate. Exercise starts when sheep have been turned southward from Drive panel. Exercise ends after stock, handler and dog go through Gate #4 and is closed.

HRDI: Handler may assume any position, dog can fetch/wear or drive before Y Chute and after stock exit Y Chute. Handler may not enter obstacle.

HRDII & HRDIII: Handlers may walk up to but may not pass the entrance of the Y chute. The stock must be driven through the Y chute. Once the stock have exited the Y Chute, the handlers may assume any position and the dog may fetch/wear or drive. Handlers may not enter obstacle.

8. Sorting/Ribbon Pull & Re Pen– 10 pts: All handlers are to move the sheep to and through the Alley gate and close gate. Move stock to and through Gate 1 to Pen A. Close gate. Gather sheep near Gate and remove ribbons that were attached to sheep in exercise 2. Place ribbons in bucket. Do not manhandle stock. HRD I & II handlers gather stock from Pen A.

HRD III handlers go to Exercise #9. Move stock through gate #1 into Alleyway and close gate. Put stock back into original Hold Pen from which stock were initially taken.

After Exercise #9, HRD III repen: Gather stock from Pen B. Handler may not enter Pen B during gather and move stock through gate #2 into Alleyway and close gate. Put stock back into original Hold Pen from which stock were initially taken.

HRDI: Handler may assume any position. The dog should hold sheep calmly while the handler removes the 1 ribbon. For the repen, handler may assume any position and may assist dog in gather inside Pen A.

HRDII: Handler may assume any position. The dog should hold sheep calmly while the handler removes the 2 ribbons. For the repen, handler must remain near gate #1 inside Pen A to gather stock.

HRDIII: Handler may assume any position. The dog should hold sheep calmly while the handler removes the 3 ribbons. For the repen, handler may not enter Pen B during gather.

Exercise begins when Gate #4 is closed. Exercise ends for all handlers when Hold Pen gate is closed.

9. Gate Sort - HRD III ONLY - 10 pts: Gate sort any three head of stock from Pen A into Alleyway. Move sorted stock through Gate #2 into Pen B. Handler returns to Pen A and gathers remaining sheep and moves them through Gate #1 into alleyway and into Pen B through Gate #2. Handler remains outside of Pen B in the alleyway. Close gate to end exercise.

Exercise begins when final ribbon is placed in bucket and ends when Gate #2 is closed. Finish with the Re Pen exercise in #8.
